Deadline Extended: Scholarship Opportunity for Child Abuse and Neglect (CAN) Conference 1-Day Track and Video Replays

The Children's Commission is offering registration scholarships for qualifying attorneys to the State Bar of Texas' 2017 Advanced Family Law Course's one-day Child Abuse and Neglect Track. The live MCLE will be presented on August 9th, 2017, in San Antonio, Texas. Subsequent video replays will be held in Houston on Friday, September 22nd; Dallas on Friday, September 29th; and South Padre Island on Friday, October 13th, 2017.

To meet the criteria for a registration scholarship, the applicant must currently represent DFPS or take appointments on the CPS docket, be in good standing with the State Bar of Texas and with their appointing or presiding judge, and commit to completing a post-event survey.

This scholarship opportunity is limited to those qualifying attorneys who are only attending the day-long Child Abuse and Neglect Track and not the full 2017 Advanced Family Law course which includes the Child Abuse and Neglect training.
